## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to maternity patient rights.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 70E of Chapter 111 of the General laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after the 7th paragraph, the following new paragraph:— 3 "Any hospital providing maternity services in the Commonwealth shall fully support all 4 mothers, upon admission, in their infant feeding decisions. This includes protecting maternity 5 patients' right to be informed and receive complete and culturally competent information and 6 materials on all infant feeding choices. When maternity patients choose a method of infant 7 feeding or medical needs necessitate a certain method, mothers shall be fully supported and 8 counseled, whether exclusively breastfeeding, using donor milk, exclusively formula feeding, or 9 breastfeeding and supplementing with pumped breastmilk, donor milk and/or infant formula. 10 Maternity patients and their health care providers shall have full access to breastfeeding and

- other infant feeding materials and educational information, including, but not limited to breast
- 12 pumps and supplies, feeding supplies and bottles, and infant formula samples and
- preparation/storage instructions. For exclusively breastfeeding mothers, infant formula and
- feeding supplies shall be provided only upon physician order or patient request."
