An Act relative to labor relations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 7 of chapter 150E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the last paragraph, as amended by section  
3 54 of chapter 176 of the acts of 2011, the following paragraph:-

4           Notwithstanding any special provision, law or regulation to the contrary, employee and  
5 employee exchange of tours shall be governed by the provisions of this chapter.
