An Act prohibiting non-consensual pelvic examinations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after  
2 Section 70H the following new section:-

3 SECTION 70I: No physician, medical student, or health care provider shall perform a  
4 pelvic examination on an anesthetized or unconscious patient without first obtaining the written  
5 informed consent from the patient unless the performance of a pelvic examination is within the  
6 scope of care for the surgical procedure or diagnostic examination to be performed on the patient  
7 or is required for diagnostic purposes.
