#### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act supporting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities in medical settings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 17 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:-
- 3 Section 21. Operation House Call
- 4 Voluntary training and accreditation program to be used in medical schools, nursing
- 5 schools, and other postsecondary education
- 6 (a) As used in this section, the following words shall have the following meanings, unless
- 7 the context clearly requires otherwise:

8	"certified training program" a voluntary training and accreditation program, accredited by
9	the department pursuant to this section, for medical professionals focusing on instruction of best
10	practices for the treatment and care of patients with intellectual and developmental disabilities,
11	including autism spectrum disorders
12	"department" the department of public health
13	"director" the director of the department of family health and nutrition, within the
14	department of public health
15	"Operation House Call" an existing program, developed by The Arc of Massachusetts,
16	that shall serve as the baseline training model
17	"school" any institution of higher education providing a course of study for students in
18	medicine or related fields
19	(b) In conjunction with the department of developmental services, and the Arc of
20	Massachusetts, the department shall establish and provide for the administration of a voluntary
21	certified training program for:
22	(i) medical schools seeking certification under subsection (d)
23	(ii) nursing schools seeking certification under subsection (d)
24	(iii) dental schools seeking certification under subsection (d)
25	(iv) other institutions of higher education with a course of study for medical
26	practitioners, including but not limited to physicians assistants, dieticians, nutritionists, physical

27	therapists, dental hygienists, allied mental health and human service professionals seeking
28	certification under subsection (d)
29	(c) The certified program established pursuant to this section shall:
30	(i) be structured based upon Operation House Call
31	(ii) be offered to participating students on a voluntary basis that is separate from
32	their required course of study
33	(iii) maintain recognized standards and practices that:
34	(A) uphold industry standards for instructing healthcare professionals on
35	best practices for the treatment and care for patients with individuals with intellectual and
36	developmental disabilities, including but not limited to autism spectrum disorders;
37	(B) include didactic classroom instruction, experiential learning, and
38	online learning, totaling not less than 6 hours.
39	(d) The department shall certify that a school offers a certified training program, as
40	described in subsection (c), upon receipt and review that:
41	(i) the school has successfully delivered the certified training program to a
42	sufficient number of participating students as mutually agreed upon by the institution and the
43	provider of the training; and
44	(ii) that the program meets the minimum standards and practices, as provided in
45	subsection (c)

- 46 (e) The director shall periodically evaluate the quality of training being provided to 47 schools seeking certification and the integrity and efficacy of the accreditation program.
- 48 (f) The department shall prepare, publish and disseminate a list of schools certified
  49 pursuant to this section; provided, however, that the list shall be updated annually. The list shall
  50 be published in a location that is accessible to prospective students seeking to apply to attend
  51 schools in the medical field or related fields.
