An Act relative to medication aides.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 72AA the following section:-
- 3 Section 72BB. (a) As used in this section the following word shall have the following
- 4 meaning:-
- 5 "Certified medication aide," any employee of a facility who has completed a department-
- 6 certified medication administration training program and is therefore qualified to dispense
- 7 medication to patients in the facility.
- 8 (b) The department shall establish rules and regulations to establish a medication
- 9 administration training and certification program for medication aides. The regulations shall

- include: (1) provisions for continuing education requirements for certified medication aides; (2)
 requirements for re-certification of certified medication aides on a biennial basis; (3) fees for the
 issuance of certification to certified medication aides; and (4) standards for qualification of
 applicants for certification, including the applicant's criminal history, work record, and
 prohibitions against behavior which may be potentially harmful to patients.
- 15 (c) The department may promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.
