The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act prohibiting the confiscation of lawfully owned firearms during a state of emergency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, shall be
- 2 amended by adding the following section:-
- 3 Section 129E. No government official or any person acting on behalf of the
- 4 Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall order the confiscation of, or otherwise cause the
- 5 confiscation of, any lawfully carried or lawfully owned firearm, rifle, shotgun, machinegun or
- 6 ammunition.
- No law enforcement officer, person acting as a law enforcement officer, or other public
- 8 official shall confiscate or attempt to confiscate any lawfully carried or lawfully owned firearm,
- 9 rifle, shotgun, machinegun or ammunition.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be subject to a civil fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000 for each firearm unlawfully confiscated or by imprisonment in a state prison for not more than two and one-half years. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the confiscation of a firearm, rifle, shotgun, machinegun or ammunition from any person who: (a) has been placed under arrest; (b) is the subject of a protection order issued under Chapter 209A; or (c) has had their firearm identification card or license to carry revoked or suspended.
