## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to the online advertising of pet care services.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 174F the following section:-
- 3 Section 174G. Any website that advertises persons for hire to provide pet care services in

4 the commonwealth shall state, on the website and in a manner easily accessible to the public,

5 that:-

- 6 (a) persons listed for hire are not necessarily accredited or certified pet care professionals;
- 7 (b) persons listed for hire are not employed by the website;
- 8 (c) individuals who hire persons listed on the website to provide pet care services do so at 9 their own risk; and

(d) a person who: (i) is a full or part-year resident of the commonwealth whose
Massachusetts gross income is \$8,000 or more must file a Massachusetts personal income tax
return; or (ii) is a nonresident of the commonwealth but whose Massachusetts gross income is
more than either \$8,000 or the prorated personal exemption , whichever is less, must file a
Massachusetts personal income tax return.
