In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to funeral and burial expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 100G of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the words "two thousand" and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the following:- "\$7,500"
- 4 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the recipients
- 5 of a death benefit under Section 100A of Chapter 32 shall also receive a reasonable amount, not
- 6 to exceed \$7,5000, for funeral and burial expenses. The state board of retirement shall adopt
- 7 regulations to administer said benefit.
