An Act reducing regulations for hair braiders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 87T of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding, after the definition of "Mobile services", the
- 3 following definition:-
- 4 "Natural Hair Braiding", twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding the

5 hair either by hand or with mechanical devices.

6 SECTION 2. Said section 87T shall be further amended by adding at the end of the

7 definition of "Hairdressing" the following:-

8 , except that "Hairdressing" shall not including Natural Hair Braiding.

9	SECTION 3. The first paragraph of section 87V of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as
10	so appearing, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following:-
11	Natural hair braiding shall be exempt from the rules and regulations issued by the Board.

12 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
