An Act relative to safety of officers by requiring interior lights in automobiles to be on during stops.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 90, of the General Laws shall be amended by adding after section  
2 62 the new section 63, the following:-

3 “Section 63. (a) When a motor vehicle is stopped by a police officer as defined in section  
4 98 of chapter 41 of the general laws, the operator shall immediately activate interior cabin  
5 lighting if present and operational, and illuminate the inside of the vehicle.

6 (b) If the operator does not immediately activate interior cabin lighting, the officer may  
7 order the operator to comply with this requirement. Noncompliance with such an order shall be  
8 considered a violation of section 25 of this chapter.”
