An Act relative to the safety and maintenance of gas shut-off valves.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 164 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following new 2 section:-
- 3 Section 145. Gate boxes on gas shut-off valves
- 4 All gas companies shall install gate boxes on all shut-off valves located on all gas mains
- 5 and services, to make valves more easily and immediately accessible. The gas companies shall
- 6 annually inspect and ensure the operability of the shut-off valves and shall ensure that the shut-
- 7 off valves are unobstructed and easily accessible.
