## AN ACT ENSURING THE PRIVACY OF CERTAIN DATA.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 93H of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (a) and inserting in place thereof  
3 the following:- (a) The department of consumer affairs and business regulation may adopt  
4 regulations relative to any person or agency that owns or licenses personal information about a  
5 resident of the commonwealth. Such regulations shall be designed to safeguard the personal  
6 information of residents of the commonwealth and shall be consistent with the safeguards for  
7 protection of personal information set forth in the federal regulations by which the person or  
8 agency is regulated. The objectives of the regulations shall be to: insure the security and  
9 confidentiality of customer information in a manner fully consistent with industry standards;  
10 protect against anticipated threats or hazards to the security or integrity of such information; and  
11 protect against unauthorized access to or use of such information that may result in substantial  
12 harm or inconvenience to any consumer. The department shall not in its regulations, however,  
13 require covered persons to use a specific technology or technologies, or a specific method or  
14 methods for protecting personal information.

15 The regulations shall take into account the person's size, scope and type of business, the amount  
16 of resources available to such person, the amount of stored data, and the need for security and  
17 confidentiality of both consumer and employee information. Notwithstanding the rules adopted  
18 by the department pursuant to the provisions above, said department shall create separate  
19 regulations for small businesses covered by this chapter that reflect said small businesses unique  
20 situation and resources.

21 Any person who is required to comply with federal laws, rules, regulations, guidance, or  
22 guidelines safeguarding personal information is deemed to be in compliance with this chapter.

23 SECTION 2. Section 6 of Chapter 93H of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
24 adding at the end thereof the following:- A willful violation of this chapter or regulations  
25 implementing this chapter, or a written information security plan issued by a person covered by  
26 state or federal privacy laws shall provide just cause for the termination of an employee, whether  
27 the employee is employed by a private person, public agency or political subdivision of the state.
