Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The bridge on Baker Street, in the West Roxbury section of the city of Boston, shall be
- 2 designated and known as The Brigadier General William J. Gormley III Bridge in honor of
- 3 William J. Gormley III who served as a Commander in the Massachusetts National Guard. The
- 4 Massachusetts Highway Department shall erect and maintain suitable markers bearing the
- 5 designation in compliance with the standards of the department.
