## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Resolve establishing a special legislative commission on young professionals.

that notwithstanding any general or special laws to the contrary, there shall be a special commission on young professionals established to examine how the Commonwealth can better engage, involve and educate young professionals in decisions and policies that effect them and the Commonwealth. The commission will examine best practices and policies to retain and attract intellectual capital that will make Massachusetts a place where young professionals want to live, work and play.

8 The commission shall consist of 21 members, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, 1 of whom shall be the secretary of housing and economic development or a designee, 9 1 of whom shall be the secretary of labor and workforce development or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the secretary of education or a designee, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Senate 1 of which from the minority party, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House 1 of which from the minority party, 1 of whom shall be the chair of the Berkshire 14 Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Worcester Young Businessmen's Association or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Greater 16 Lawrence Young Professionals Network or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Young Professionals Society of Greater Springfield or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Northampton Area Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of ONEinThree Boston or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Young 19 20 Professionals of Greater Lowell or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the North of Boston Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Executive

- 25 When the commission sees fit by a majority vote they may add additional members to the

- The commission shall meet within 30 days of passage of this Act, and not less than
- 28 quarterly thereafter, and shall release final recommendations to Governor's Office and House
- 29 and Senate Ways and Means Committees no later than 18 months from passage of this Act.
