### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act closing a loophole in the lobbying law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 45 of chapter 3 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is
- 2 hereby amended by striking out subsection (m) and inserting in place thereof the following
- 3 subsection:-
- 4 (m) The state secretary shall automatically disqualify any person convicted of a felony in
- 5 violation of chapter 3, chapter 55, or chapter 268A, or any person convicted of any other state or
- 6 federal felony crime of political corruption, including without limitation violations of sections
- 7 1341, 1343, 1346, or 1951 of title 18 of the United States Code, from acting or registering as an
- 8 executive or legislative agent for a period of 10 years from the date of conviction.
