1           SECTION 1. To provide for a program to protect, repair and improve the capital  
2 facilities of the commonwealth and for a program of capital asset acquisitions, dispositions and  
3 other improvements for general government operations, the sums set forth in sections 2, 2A, 2B  
4 and 2C, inclusive, for the several purposes and subject to the conditions specified in this act are  
5 hereby made available, subject to the laws regulating the disbursement of public funds, which  
6 sums shall be in addition to any other amounts previously appropriated for these purposes.

**EXECUTIVE OFFICE FOR ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE**

**Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance**

8           1102-2017 For costs associated with planning and studies, dispositions, acquisition of  
9 land and buildings and interests therein by purchase, prepayment of lease for a term that exceeds  
10 the useful life of the facility, gift or other transfer or by eminent domain pursuant to chapter 79  
11 of the General Laws, for the preparation of plans and specifications, disparity studies, repairs,  
12 construction, renovations, improvements, asset management, accessibility improvements,  
13 demolition, disposition and remediation of state-owned and former county facilities and grounds  
14 and for costs associated with repair and maintenance of buildings and building systems and

15 equipment at various facilities of the commonwealth; provided, that any federal reimbursement  
16 received by a state agency in connection with projects funded from this item may be retained by  
17 the executive office for administration and finance and expended for the purposes of the project,  
18 without further appropriation, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this item; provided  
19 further, that all maintenance and repair work funded in this item shall be listed in the capital asset  
20 management information system administered by the division of capital asset management and  
21 maintenance; provided further, that where appropriate, the commissioner of capital asset  
22 management and maintenance may transfer funds authorized in this item in accordance with a  
23 delegation of project control and supervision process pursuant to section 5 of chapter 7C of the  
24 General Laws; provided further, that funds so transferred shall be distributed based on the  
25 severity of the need that the repair shall address and other criteria developed by the division, in  
26 consultation with the secretary of administration and finance; provided further, that \$1,000,000  
27 shall be expended for repairs and improvement of the state highway route 146 pedestrian bridge  
28 at the Blackstone Heritage Corridor visitor center in the city of Worcester; provided further, that  
29 \$5,000,000 shall be expended for the repairs, renovations and improvements to the Turnure  
30 Terrace building and for the acquisition, design and construction of new senior and low-income  
31 family housing in the town of Lenox; provided further, that \$3,000,000 shall be expended for  
32 improvements at Smith Vocational and Agricultural high school in the city of Northampton;  
33 provided further, that \$1,500,000 shall be expended for structural analysis and construction  
34 upgrades of the old comfort station building owned by the department of conservation and  
35 recreation located on the Neponset river greenway walking and bike path in the Mattapan square  
36 neighborhood in the Mattapan section of the city of Boston to improve the building so that the  
37 department may advertise the space for lease for a small business which will benefit the

38 surrounding community including, but not limited to, a coffee shop, an ice cream shop or a bike  
39 shop; provided further, that \$500,000 shall be expended for the drafting and creation of a plan for  
40 infrastructure, improvement and future public access to the Neponset river alongside the property  
41 owned by the department of conservation and recreation on Edgewater drive in the Mattapan  
42 section of the city of Boston; provided further, that \$5,000,000 shall be expended to rebuild the  
43 department of conservation and recreation’s Metropolis ice rink in the town of Canton; provided  
44 further, that \$1,000,000 shall be expended for the repairs and improvements to the stone cottage  
45 location at High Rock Tower reservation in the city of Lynn; provided further, that \$1,000,000  
46 shall be expended for the renovation and improvement of the Connery memorial rink in the city  
47 Lynn; and provided further, that \$100,000 shall be expended for the renovation and improvement

68 provided further, that funds shall be expended for the design, construction and relocation of the  
69 department of youth services Paul T. Leahy Center in the city of Worcester; provided further,  
70 that \$30,000,000 be expended for the cost associated with the repair, renovation or construction  
71 of a skilled nursing facility, or a facility of last resort, for adults diagnosed with a disability or  
72 mental health issues; provided further, that such facility shall maintain at least 70 per cent of its  
73 beds for medically-involved, mentally ill individuals; provided further that MassHealth shall  
74 determine a rate structure for the facility that reflects medically-appropriate care; and provided  
75 further, that \$20,000,000 shall be made available for critical systems improvements at the  
76 Taunton State Hospital in the city of Taunton .....\$401,000,000

77 7066-2018 For the costs associated with the plans and specifications, planning and  
78 studies, repairs, construction, reconstruction, demolition, remediation, rehabilitation,

81 and construction by the division of capital asset management and maintenance shall be consistent

144 expended for division employees may include the salary and salary-related expenses of these  
145 employees to the extent that they work on or in support of these projects; provided further, that

212 further, that \$4,000,000 shall be expended for the establishment and construction of a Boston

213 Public Library branch in the South Boston waterfront section of the city of Boston; provided  
214 further, that \$4,000,000 shall be expended for the construction of an Upham’s Corner library and  
215 for the renovation of the Strand Theatre in the Dorchester section of the city of Boston; provided

313 SECTION 14. Subsection (d) of section 49 of chapter 9 of the acts of 2011 is hereby  
314 amended by striking out, in line 4, the figure “\$100,000” and inserting in place thereof the  
315 following figure:- \$150,000.

316 SECTION 15. Subsection (e) of said section 49 of said chapter 9 is hereby amended by  
317 striking out the words “January 1, 2017”, inserted by section 23 of chapter 119 of the acts of  
318 2015, and inserting in place thereof the following words:- January 1, 2019.



319 SECTION 16. Subsection (f) of said section 49 of said chapter 9 is hereby amended by  
320 striking out the words “June 1, 2017”, inserted by section 24 of said chapter 119, and inserting in  
321 place thereof the following words:- June 30, 2019.

322 SECTION 17. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out sections 2 and 2A, the  
323 state treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in  
324 an amount to be specified by the governor, but not exceeding in the aggregate \$3,031,000,000.  
325 All such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on their face Capital  
326 Improvement Act of 2017 and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 30  
327 years, as the governor recommends to the general court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of  
328 the Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2052.  
329 All interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall be payable from the  
330 General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section shall, notwithstanding  
331 any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

332 SECTION 18. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out section 2B, the state  
333 treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an  
334 amount to be specified by the governor, but not exceeding in the aggregate \$320,000,000. All  
335 such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on their face Capital Improvement  
336 Act of 2017 and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 20 years, as the  
337 governor recommends to the general court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of the  
338 Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2042. All  
339 interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall be payable from the  
340 General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section shall, notwithstanding  
341 any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

342 SECTION 19. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out section 2C, the state  
343 treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an  
344 amount to be specified by the governor, but not exceeding in the aggregate \$20,000,000. All  
345 such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on their face Capital Improvement  
346 Act of 2017 and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 10 years, as the  
347 governor recommends to the general court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of the  
348 Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2032. All  
349 interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall be payable from the  
350 General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section shall, notwithstanding  
351 any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

352 SECTION 20. The secretary of administration and finance shall submit a report on the  
353 progress of projects funded through the authorizations in this act and included in the governor's  
354 5-year capital investment plan to the clerks of the senate and house of representatives, the chairs  
355 of the senate and house committees on ways and means and the chairs of the senate and house  
356 committees on bonding, capital expenditures and state assets. The report shall include, but not be  
357 limited to: (i) the planned spending for the previous year; (ii) the actual spending for the previous  
358 year; (iii) the planned spending for the current year; (iv) the spending to date for the current year;  
359 (v) the original estimated total project cost; (vi) the project description; (vii) the location of the  
360 project; (viii) the type of spending; (ix) the type of asset; and (x) the useful life of the project  
361 once completed. The report shall be submitted not later than June 30 and December 31 of each  
362 year for a period of 8 years after the effective date of this act.

363 SECTION 21. To provide for the continued availability of certain bond-funded spending  
364 authorizations which otherwise would expire, the balances of the following items and any

365 allocations thereof shall be extended through June 30, 2020 for the purposes of and subject to the  
366 conditions stated for these items in the original authorizations and any amendments to such  
367 authorizations: 0640-0035, 1100-9201, 1599-7061, 1599-7062, 1599-7063, 1790-3001, 1790-  
368 3002, 1790-3003, 1790-3004, 1100-3001, and 8000-2030.

369 SECTION 22. To provide for the continued availability of certain bond-funded spending  
370 authorizations which otherwise would expire, the balances of the following items and any  
371 allocations thereof shall be extended through June 30, 2022 for the purposes of and subject to the  
372 conditions stated for these items in the original authorizations and any amendments to such  
373 authorizations: 0640-0302, 0330-2223, 1100-3002, 1100-3003, 1102-2009, 1102-2014, 1102-  
374 2015, 1102-2016, 1102-5600, 1790-2500, 2200-7021, 4000-2020, 4000-2022, 7000-9091, 7002-  
375 8018, 7066-8000, 7100-1000, 8000-3501, 8000-0701, 8000-2021, 8000-2022, 8100-2026, 8900-  
376 7500, and 8900-8500.
