**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to LLC filing fees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 12 of Chapter 156C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking subsection (d) and inserting in place thereof the
3 following:-

4 (d) The fee for the filing of the certificate of organization required by subsection (a) shall
5 be five hundred dollars. The fee for the filing of the annual report required by subsection (c) shall
6 be five hundred dollars, except as provided in subsection (e). Such fees shall be paid to the state
7 secretary at the time the certificate of organization or the annual report is filed.

8 (e) The fee for the filing of the certificate of organization required by subsection (a) for a
9 limited liability company with 6 employees or fewer shall be two hundred and fifty dollars. The
10 fee for the filing of the annual report required by subsection (c) for a limited liability company

- 11 with 6 employees or fewer shall be two hundred and fifty dollars. Such fees shall be paid to the
- 12 state secretary at the time the annual report is filed.
