An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Therese Cormier, an employee of the Trial Court.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the trial court, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the trial court shall establish a  
2 sick leave bank for Therese Cormier, an employee of the Bristol county juvenile court in the  
3 department of the trial court. Any employee of the trial court may voluntarily contribute 1 or  
4 more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Therese Cormier.  
5 Whenever Therese Cormier terminates employment with the trial court or requests to dissolve  
6 the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the trial  
7 court paid leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness  
8 or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the trial  
9 court.
