

SENATE No. 2513

Senate, November 22, 2023 -- Text of the Senate amendment (Senator Mark) to the House Bill authorizing the town of Conway to continue the employment of police officer Randall Williams (House, No. 2448).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Randall
2 Williams, a member of the police department of the town of Conway, may continue in his
3 position until he reaches 70 years of age, the date of his retirement or his non-reappointment,
4 whichever occurs first; provided, however, that he is mentally and physically capable of
5 performing the duties of his position. The select board of the town of Conway may, at the town's
6 expense, require that Randall Williams be examined annually by a physician designated by the
7 select board to determine his physical and mental capability to perform the duties of his position.
8 While continuing to serve as a police officer in the town of Conway, Randall Williams shall
9 comply with all requirements of chapter 6E of the General Laws, including: (i) maintaining
10 certification and good standing with the Massachusetts Peace Officer Standards and Training
11 Commission; and (ii) complying with all in-service and other training requirements mandated by
12 the municipal police training committee. No further deductions shall be made from the regular
13 compensation of Randall Williams under chapter 32 of the General Laws for any service
14 subsequent to his reaching 65 years of age and, upon retirement, Randall Williams shall receive a
15 superannuation retirement allowance equal to that which he would have been entitled had he
16 retired at 65 years of age.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
