By Ms. Creem, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2529) of Cynthia Stone Creem and Tommy Vitolo (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the expenditure of \$500,000 from town of Brookline Marijuana Mitigation Stabilization Fund for purpose of advancing racial equity in the town of Brookline. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)

An Act authorizing the expenditure of \$500,000 from town of Brookline Marijuana Mitigation Stabilization Fund for purpose of advancing racial equity in the town of Brookline.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 3 of chapter 94G of the General Laws, section 5B
2 of chapter 40, section 53 of chapter 44 of the General Laws, or any other general or special law
3 to the contrary, the Town of Brookline is authorized to spend \$500,000 from the Town's
4 Marijuana Mitigation Stabilization Fund (consisting of funds derived from Host Community
5 Agreement mitigation fees from licensed cannabis establishments) for the purpose of supporting
6 projects, programs and initiatives that advance racial equity and racial justice within the
7 Brookline community. Such monies shall be expended in conformity with Select Board
8 regulations and/or such terms as the Select Board may specify.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
