### AN ACT TO AMEND REGIONAL SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION FUNDING.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The Board of Education is directed to develop for fiscal year 2011 a method to  
2 include mandated regional school transportation as defined in Section 16C of Chapter 71 of the General  
3 Laws as a category of aid in the chapter 70 funding formula, to be included in state school aid. The  
4 method adopted shall also include a provision to include prior years regional transportation aid as “base  
5 aid.”

6           SECTION 2. The Board of Education shall develop such method and file appropriate legislation  
7 with the Clerk of the Senate by November 30, 2009.
