An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Kim Souza, an employee of the Trial Court.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish a sick leave bank for an employee of the Bristol Superior Court Probation Department, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the trial court of the
2 Commonwealth shall establish a sick leave bank for Kim Souza, an employee of the Bristol
3 Superior Court Probation Department. Any employee of the trial court may voluntarily
4 contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Kim Souza.
5 If Kim Souza terminates employment with the trial court or requests to dissolve the sick leave
6 bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the trial court paid leave
7 bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability
8 that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the trial court.
