In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to enhancing special education services delivery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, the department
2	of elementary and secondary education in partnership with one or more Massachusetts
3	institutions of higher learning, local educational authorities and private educational providers,
4	shall study the delivery of special education services in the commonwealth pursuant to chapter
5	71B of the General Laws and all applicable federal laws, including the Individuals with
6	Disabilities Educational Act of 1990.
7	Said study shall include a comprehensive evaluation of existing and potential models for

Said study, together with any legislative recommendations, shall be filed with the joint
committee on education and the clerks of the senate and the house of representatives not later
than May 1, 2019."
