In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act establishing a low vision registry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is
- 2 hereby amended by inserting after section 135 the following section:-
- 3 Section 135A. The Commissioner, in consultation with the department of public health
- 4 and the executive office of elder affairs, shall create a registry list of persons whose visual acuity
- 5 is found to be with correction 20/60 or less in the better eye, or the peripheral field of vision to
- 6 have contracted to the ten degrees radius or less regardless of visual acuity. Said register shall be
- 7 used to aid the commission in efforts to measure the numbers of likely future registrants to the
- 8 Commonwealth Registry of the Blind. Such persons shall not be eligible for services from the
- 9 Commission until the standard of legal blindness is met.

- The reporting requirements contained in section 136 of this chapter shall apply to this
- 11 section.
