An Act An act relative to wastewater facilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any other general or special law to the contrary, the department of
2 environmental protection shall evaluate the feasibility, cost, advantages and disadvantages of
3 obtaining from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, to the extent permitted by
4 federal law, delegated authority over National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System
5 (NPDES) programs. The department shall file a report detailing its findings, together with any
6 legislative recommendations necessary to obtaining such authority, with the clerks of the senate
7 and the house of representatives not later than August 1, 2015.
