The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to special education health care costs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the

2 following section:-

3 Section 28. The commission shall provide to an active or retired employee of the

4 commonwealth who is insured under the group insurance commission benefits on a

5 nondiscriminatory basis for the medically necessary treatment for disease, illness, injury, or

6 bodily dysfunction which are required by a student's individual education program,

7 individualized family service plan, individualized service plan or the federal Individuals with

8 Disabilities Education Improvement Act.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
10 section 47AA the following section:-

11 Section 47EE. An individual policy of accident and sickness insurance issued under section 108 that provides hospital expense and surgical expense insurance and any group blanket 12 or general policy of accident and sickness insurance issued under section 110 that provides 13 hospital expense and surgical expense insurance, which is issued or renewed within or without 14 15 the commonwealth, shall provide benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis for the medically necessary treatment for disease, illness, injury, or bodily dysfunction which are required by a 16 student's individual education program, individualized family service plan, individualized 17 service plan or the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act. 18

SECTION 3. Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
section 8DD the following section:-

Section 8GG. A contract between a subscriber and the corporation under an individual or group hospital service plan which is issued or renewed within or without the commonwealth shall provide benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis for the medically necessary treatment for disease, illness, injury, or bodily dysfunction which are required by a student's individual education program, individualized family service plan, individualized service plan or the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act.

SECTION 4. Chapter 176B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
 section 4DD the following section:-

Section 4GG. A subscription certificate under an individual or group medical service
agreement which is issued or renewed within or without the commonwealth shall provide

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benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis for the medically necessary treatment for disease, illness,
injury, or bodily dysfunction which are required by a student's individual education program,
individualized family service plan, individualized service plan or the federal Individuals with
Disabilities Education Improvement Act.

35 SECTION 5. Chapter 176G of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
 36 section 4V the following section:-

37 Section 4Y. A health maintenance contract issued or renewed within or without the 38 commonwealth shall provide benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis for the medically necessary 39 treatment for disease, illness, injury, or bodily dysfunction which are required by a student's 40 individual education program, individualized family service plan, individualized service plan or 41 the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act.

42 SECTION 6. All policies, contracts and certificates of health insurance subject to section 43 28 of chapter 32A, section 47EE of chapter 175, section 8GG of chapter 176A, section 4GG of 44 chapter 176B, and section 4Y of chapter 176G of the General Laws which are delivered, issued 45 or renewed on or after January 1, 2016 shall conform with the provisions of this act. Form filings 46 implementing this act shall be subject to the approval of the commissioner of insurance.

47 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect on January 1, 2016.
