#### AN ACT ESTABLISHING A HEALTHY CHILD SCHOLARSHIP.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Whereas, Governor Deval Patrick and the Executive Office of Health and Human Services have
- 2 announced a comprehensive plan called Mass in Motion to promote healthier lifestyles and
- 3 combat overweight and obesity in the Commonwealth; and
- 4 Whereas, one of the programs established through Mass in Motion will mandate Body Mass
- 5 Index (BMI) testing of students attending public schools in the Commonwealth; and
- 6 Whereas, one-third of middle and high school students in the Commonwealth are reportedly
- 7 overweight or obese; and
- 8 Whereas, being overweight or obesity increases the risk of developing serious medical
- 9 conditions such as diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, certain forms of cancer, and stroke; and
- Whereas, those with serious medical conditions place greater demands on the health care system
- and increase costs; and
- Whereas, healthy lifestyles can begin during adolescence; and
- Whereas, it is in the interest of the Commonwealth to contain rising health care costs and
- encourage our students to exercise and eat healthy;
- 15 Therefore, be it enacted, as follows:
- 16 SECTION 1.
- 17 Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended
- by inserting after section 16 the following section:-

- 19 Section 16A. Healthy Child Scholarship
- 20 The board of higher education, in consultation with the department of public health, shall
- 21 establish a "Healthy Child Scholarship." The board shall adopt guidelines governing the
- implementation of the scholarship, which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 23 (1) the scholarship shall be awarded to tenth grade students attending public schools in the
- 24 Commonwealth who are within an acceptable BMI range or who have improved their BMI since
- 25 the test was last administered in middle school, provided in both instances that BMI testing is
- administered at the school;
- 27 (2) the amount of the scholarship shall not be less than \$100 and shall not be presented publicly
- 28 by any state or local authority or official;
- 29 (3) the scholarship shall be presented by the board on behalf of the governor and the legislature,
- but under no circumstances shall the scholarship funds shall be distributed until the student
- 31 verifies enrollment in an undergraduate or associate degree program at a state institution of
- 32 higher learning. The board shall make each recipient aware of the guidelines of the scholarship
- 33 program.
- 34 (4) the board shall document the name and contact information of each scholarship recipient and
- 35 shall make reasonable efforts to notify recipients during their senior year of high school of the
- 36 scholarship funds they have been awarded and the eligibility for receiving such funds.
- 37 The board and the department of public health shall promulgate such regulations and other
- written guidance as needed to implement and administer the scholarship.
