The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to out-of-pocket expenses for prescription drug coverage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 175 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after section 230 the following section:-
- 3 Section 228. Patient Cost-Sharing Obligation for Prescription Drugs
- 4 (A) As used in this section the following words shall, unless the context clearly requires
- 5 otherwise, have the following meanings:-
- 6 "Connector" means the Commonwealth health insurance connector authority.
- 7 (B) Not withstanding any law, after January 1, 2021, each health insurance carrier that
- 8 sells state-regulated plans outside of the Connector, including individual, small group and large
- 9 group plans, shall apply the prescription drug cost-sharing requirements of the Connector Silver

- or Gold standard benefit designs to at least fifty percent of plans offered in said markets. Costsharing includes copayments, coinsurance, and deductibles.
- 12 (C) For a plan that meets the requirements of a High Deductible Health Plan as defined in 13 section 223(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the requirements of subsection B shall 14 apply after the minimum annual deductible specified in section 223(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue 15 Code of 1986 is reached.
- (D) The Massachusetts Division of Insurance shall promulgate any regulations necessary
 to implement and enforce this Act.
