The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to protect medically fragile kids.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 12C of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
 following section:-
- 3 Section 24. The center, in conjunction with MassHealth, shall prepare a biennial report 4 related to patients requiring continuous skilled nursing care, as defined in 101 CMR 350.02 and 5 130 CMR 403.402. The report shall include, but not be limited to: (i) the number of pediatric 6 patients and the number of adult patients requiring continuous skilled nursing care; (ii) the 7 average, median and total number of continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth 8 per day, week, month and year for pediatric patients and for adult patients; (iii) the average, 9 median and total number of authorized continuous skilled nursing hours actually delivered per 10 day, week, month and year for pediatric patients and for adult patients; (iv) the proportion of 11 utilization to authorization of service hours in comparison to patient acuity for pediatric patients 12 and for adult patients; (v) the number of nurses providing continuous skilled nursing care to

13 more than 1 patient at a time and the proportion of utilization to authorization of said patients; 14 (vi) the number of nurses who contract with MassHealth to provide continuous skilled nursing 15 care and the number of nurses who provide continuous skilled nursing care through a home 16 health agency that contracts with MassHealth and whether the total number of nurses providing 17 such care is sufficient to fill all authorized continuous skilled nursing hours; (vii) the training, 18 experience and education level of the nurses who contract with MassHealth to provide 19 continuous skilled nursing care; and (viii) an evaluation of the adequacy of the reimbursement 20 rates for continuous skilled nursing, as defined in 101 CMR 350.04(2), and a comparison of those rates between the rate paid to nurses who contract directly with MassHealth to provide 21 22 continuous skilled nursing care, the portion of the reimbursement rate paid directly as wages to 23 nurses providing continuous skilled nursing care through a home health agency that contracts 24 with MassHealth, and the median wage rate paid to all nurses in the commonwealth.

Not later than January 1 of each even-numbered year, the report shall be filed with the secretary of health and human services, the clerks of the senate and the house of representatives, the joint committee on health care financing, the joint committee on public health and the senate and house committees on ways and means. The center shall make the report publicly available on its website.

30 SECTION 2. Chapter 118E of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
31 following section:-

Section 78. (a) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, and subject to
 appropriation, the executive office of health and human services shall increase the budget for

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continuous skilled nursing care, as defined in 101 CMR 350.02 and 130 CMR 403.402, by an
amount that ensures:

36 (1) At least 55 percent of continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth are
37 filled on or before July 1, 2021;

38 (2) At least 65 percent of continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth are
39 filled on or before July 1, 2022;

40 (3) At least 75 percent of continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth are
41 filled on or before July 1, 2023; and

42 (4) At least 85 percent of continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth are
43 filled on or before July 1, 2024, and shall remain at 85 percent or above thereafter.

(b) The executive office of health and human services may require any portion of the
budget increases provided for in this section to be used exclusively to increase the wage payment
rate of nurses providing continuous skilled nursing care.

47 (c) To satisfy the requirements in subsection (a), the executive office of health and human
48 services shall require MassHealth to submit an annual report no later than January 1 that:

49 (1) demonstrates that MassHealth has not changed its authorization criteria for

50 continuous skilled nursing services in a way that is more restrictive and results in a reduction in

51 the amount of authorized hours that would have been authorized previously; and

(2) includes the following information from the immediately preceding calendar year: (i)
 the number of filled and unfilled continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth; (ii)

54 the number of appeals received by MassHealth for the denial or modification of continuous

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55	skilled nursing hours and the number of patients that filed an appeal; (iii) the number of patients
56	that received a reduction in the amount of authorized continuous skilled nursing hours; and (iv)
57	the number of authorized continuous skilled nursing hours reduced from the immediately
58	preceding calendar year, if any.
59	(d) The executive office of health and human services, in conjunction with MassHealth
60	and after consultation with the Massachusetts Pediatric Nursing Care Campaign, shall adopt
61	regulations to implement this section.
62	(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit filling 85 percent of the
63	continuous skilled nursing hours authorized by MassHealth prior to July 1, 2024.
64	SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the office of
65	Medicaid shall review the wage payment rates established by home health agencies that provide
66	continuous skilled nursing care, as defined in 101 CMR 350.02 and 130 CMR 403.402, for the
67	providers of those services. The office shall provide: (i) an aggregated overview of the wage
68	payment rates paid by home health agencies to staff or contracted nurses providing continuous
69	skilled nursing care, including any increases in said wage rates resulting from increases in
70	Medicaid rates paid to home health agencies for continuous skilled nursing care in state fiscal
71	years 2017 and 2018; (ii) an aggregated breakdown of said wage rates as applied to the acuity
72	level of patients receiving continuous skilled nursing care; (iii) an aggregated breakdown of said
73	wage rates as applied to the licensure level of the providers of continuous skilled nursing care;
74	(iv) recommendations on criteria to be included in any future reporting by home health agencies
75	receiving an increase of continuous skilled nursing care rates provided by the office. The office
76	shall provide this report not later than March 1, 2020 to the clerks of the senate and house of

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77	representatives, the joint committee on health care financing and the senate and house
78	committees on ways and means. Home health agencies providing continuous skilled nursing care
79	shall provide all information and documentation requested by the office of Medicaid to compile
80	the required report under this section.
81	SECTION 4. The first report required pursuant to section 24 of chapter 12C of the

82 General Laws shall be filed on January 1, 2021.
