In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

ordered, that there shall be a special senate committee to review and report on citizen engagement and participation in the legislative process. The review shall include, but not be limited to: (i) senate session broadcasting, including streaming on the general court website, and broadcast or distribution to local cable access stations; (ii) remote access and participation by the public; and (iii) guidelines and standards for social media use by members and staff. The committee shall consist of 7 members of the senate: the majority leader and minority leader, who shall serve as co-chairs; 3 members appointed by the senate president; and 2 members appointed by the minority leader. The committee may consult with experts in broadcasting, media production and others as determined by the co-chairs in order to facilitate the committee's work. The committee may file an interim report; provided, however, that the committee shall file a final report of its findings with the clerk of the senate not later than June 1, 2017. The final report

- shall include recommendations to increase citizen engagement and participation in the legislative
- process and cost estimates, if any, to implement the committee's recommendations.
