The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to sentencing laws.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be a commission to study the issue of prison
2 overcrowding, the threat overcrowding poses to public safety and to make recommendations for
3 the reduction in the population of the commonwealth’s prisons, houses of corrections and jails.
4 The commission shall include and be co-chaired by the senate and house chairs of the joint
5 committee on public safety. The commission’s other members shall be the secretary of public
6 safety, the commissioner of the department of corrections, the president of the Massachusetts
7 Sheriff’s Association, and a representative of the Massachusetts Correctional Legal Services.

8 SECTION 2. Chapter 276, as appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby
9 amended by striking out section 42 and inserting the following new section:-

10 Section 42. If it appears that a crime has been committed and that there is
11 probable cause to believe the prisoner guilty, the court or justice shall, if final jurisdiction is not
12 exercised, admit the prisoner to bail, if the crime isailable and sufficient bail is offered;
13 otherwise, except as provided for in section 16 of chapter 125, such prisoner shall be either
14 committed to jail or placed under electronic supervision by the sheriff until trial. If a prisoner
15 cannot offer sufficient bail, the court may place them under electronic supervision by the sheriff
16 as an alternative to being committed to a jail.

17 SECTION 3. Section 57 of chapter 276, as so appearing, is hereby further
18 amended by inserting in line 9 after the words “or witness to bail” the following words:- or
19 electronic supervision by the sheriff

20 SECTION 4. Section 57 of chapter 276, as so appearing, is hereby further
21 amended by inserting in line 13 after the words “to take bail” the following words:- or placed on
22 electronic supervision
