AN ACT EXPEDITING APPEALS OF WAGE VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (b) (4) of Section 27C of Chapter 149 of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the third
3 sentence the following: “The division shall render a final written decision within 90 days of the
4 receipt of the appeal.”

5 SECTION 2. Subsection (b) (4) of Section 27C of Chapter 149 of the General Laws, as
6 appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby further amended by striking the last sentence
7 and inserting in place thereof the following:

8 “Any person aggrieved by a decision of the hearing officer may appeal to the superior court by
9 bringing an action within 20 days after the division has rendered a final decision.”
