AN ACT RELATIVE TO EMPLOYER LIABILITY PROTECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 52C of chapter 149 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2006 official addition, is
- amended by inserting at the end of said Section 52C the following new section: -
- 3 "Section 52D. (A) Unless otherwise provided by law, an employer, or an employer's designee, who
- 4 discloses information about a current or former employee to a prospective employer of the employee shall
- 5 be absolutely immune from civil liability if the disclosed information includes any or all of the following:
- 6 (1) date of employment; (2) pay level; (3) job description and duties; and (4) wage history. An employer
- 7 who responds in writing to a written request concerning a former employee from a prospective employer
- 8 of that employee shall be absolutely immune from civil liability if the disclosed information includes
- 9 either or both of the following: (1) written employee evaluations which were conducted prior to the
- 10 employee's separation from the employer; and (2) whether the employee was voluntarily or involuntarily
- released from service and the reasons for the separation."
