An Act relative to assault and battery attempting to disarm a police officer

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whoever commits an offense set forth in section thirteen D of chapter two  
2 hundred and sixty-five of the Massachusetts General Laws where said offense includes the  
3 attempt to disarm a police officer in the performance of his duty, shall be punished by  
4 imprisonment in the state prison for not more than ten years, or by a fine of not more than one  
5 thousand dollars and imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more than two and  
6 one-half years.
