In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to spousal immunity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 20 of chapter 233 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by striking out the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following paragraph:-
- 4 Second, Except as otherwise provided in section seven of chapter two hundred and
- 5 seventy-three and except in any proceeding relating to child abuse, including incest, neither
- 6 husband nor wife shall be compelled to testify before a grand jury or in the trial or any pre-trial
- 7 or post-trial hearing, of an indictment, complaint, or other criminal proceeding against the other.
