An Act relative to UMass tuition credit.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1B of Chapter 75 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby  
2 amended by adding at the end of subsection (f) the following words:- “The value of the tuition  
3 credit shall be adjusted annually to ensure the value of said credit is worth no less than 12.5 % of  
4 the total student charges for the academic year.”

5           SECTION 2. Said Section 1B of said Chapter 75, as so appearing, is hereby further  
6 amended by striking out subsection (g) and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:-

7           (g) The board of trustees shall not accept any tuition waivers, grants or scholarships  
8 identified in chapter 15A or any other general or special law that are in the form of tuition or fee  
9 waivers established on or after July 1, 2016 unless the reduction is accompanied with an

- 10 appropriation that fully supports the reduction or the reduction is approved by the board of
- 11 trustees or unless said reduction is secured in a collective bargaining contract.
