## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**  
\_\_\_\_\_

An Act authorizing the funding of capital expenditures for workforce development and adult basic education..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. To provide for a capital outlay program to support the capital needs of  
2 the adult basic education and workforce development systems so that these systems may better  
3 provide training to adults in the commonwealth who lack the skills necessary to obtain gainful  
4 employment, the sums set forth in section 2, for the several purposes and subject to the  
5 conditions specified in this act, are hereby made available subject to the laws regulating the  
6 disbursement of public funds.

7           SECTION 2. Department of Labor and Workforce Development 7003-xxxx For the  
8 purposes of state financial assistance in the form of competitive loans or grants for the

9 construction, renovation and rental of classroom space used for the purpose of providing  
10 vocational training to adults in the commonwealth; for the purchase of computers, software and  
11 equipment, and the support services necessary for the use of such materials, used in the provision  
12 of vocational training to adults in the commonwealth; and to strengthen the provision of  
13 vocational training to adults in the commonwealth; provided, that said grants shall be  
14 administered by the department of labor and workforce development, through the commonwealth  
15 corporation, and shall be available to public or non-profit agencies that provide training to  
16 recipients of TAFDC or who are authorized by the department to accept individual training  
17 accounts pursuant to the Workforce Investment Act and that serve a majority of unemployed  
18 adults, adults with limited English proficiency or low-wage workers, as that term is used in  
19 section 2RR(b)(1)(i) of chapter 29; provided further, that the agencies receiving grants will be  
20 selected competitively by the department; provided further, that not less than 20 percent of the  
21 grants awarded shall be to agencies that provide training programs which combine adult basic  
22 education or English proficiency training with vocational training; and provided further, that  
23 preference shall be given to agencies that have demonstrated satisfactory levels of performance  
24 as defined and determined by the department, including the placement of workers in living wage  
25 jobs, and applications that demonstrate the likelihood of an adequate return on the  
26 commonwealth's investment.....\$100,000,000

27 Department of Education 7035 - xxxx For the purposes of state financial assistance in the form  
28 of competitive loans or grants for the construction, renovation and rental of classroom space used  
29 for the purpose of providing educational services to adults in the commonwealth who lack a high  
30 school diploma or general equivalency diploma or who lack English proficiency; for the  
31 purchase of computers, software, and equipment, and the support services necessary for the use

32 of such materials, used in the provision of educational services to adults in the commonwealth  
33 who lack a high school diploma or general equivalency diploma or who lack English proficiency;  
34 and to strengthen the provision of educational services to adults in the commonwealth who lack a  
35 high school diploma or general equivalency diploma or who lack English proficiency; provided,  
36 that said grants shall be administered by the department of education and shall be available to  
37 public or non-profit agencies that the department approves to provide adult educational services  
38 and who serve a majority of unemployed adults, adults with limited English proficiency or low-  
39 wage workers, as that term is used in section 2RR(b)(1)(i) of chapter 29; provided further, that  
40 the agencies receiving grants will be selected competitively by the department; provided further,  
41 that the department shall work with the commonwealth corporation to create programs that  
42 combine adult basic education or English proficiency training with vocational training; and  
43 provided further, that preference shall be given to agencies that have demonstrated satisfactory  
44 levels of performance as defined and determined by the department, including the placement of  
45 workers in living wage jobs, and applications that demonstrate the likelihood of an adequate  
46 return on the commonwealth's investment.....\$100,000,000

47 SECTION 3. To meet the expenditures necessary to carry out section 2, the state  
48 treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an  
49 amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate,  
50 \$200,000,000. All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall be designated on their  
51 face, Workforce Development Improvement Loan, Act of 2003, and shall be issued for such  
52 maximum terms of years, not exceeding 20 years, as the governor may recommend to the general  
53 court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution; provided,  
54 however, that all such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2029. All interest and

55 payments on account of principal on such obligations shall be payable from the General Fund.  
56 Bonds and interest thereon issued under authority of this section shall, notwithstanding any other  
57 provisions of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

58           SECTION 4. The state treasurer may borrow from time to time on the credit of the  
59 commonwealth such sums as may be necessary for the purpose of meeting payments authorized  
60 by section 2 and may issue and renew from time to time notes of the commonwealth therefor,  
61 bearing interest payable at such times and at such rates as shall be fixed by the state treasurer.  
62 The notes shall be issued and may be renewed one or more times for such terms, not exceeding  
63 one year, as the governor may recommend to the general court in accordance with Section 3 of  
64 Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution, but the final maturities of such notes,  
65 whether original or renewal, shall not be later than June 30, 2011. Notes and interest thereon  
66 issued under the authority of this section, shall be general obligations of the Commonwealth.
