**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**  
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An Act relative to MBTA billboards in the city of Quincy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the  
2 contrary, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority or its successors, including but not  
3 limited to the Division of Public Transit in the Massachusetts Surface Transportation Authority  
4 shall be prohibited from constructing, erecting, placing and/or maintaining any off premises  
5 sign(s) which is a sign that advertises or announces a use conducted or goods provided that are  
6 available elsewhere than within the building and/or structure and/or the lot on which the sign(s)  
7 is located within the City of Quincy.
