An Act protecting victims of unlicensed debt collections.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 28 of Chapter 93 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following:-
- 3 "Any person who engages in the business of debt collection without a license shall be
- 4 liable in restitution to any person collected against, and all other persons similarly situated to
- 5 such person who the court certifies are members of a class under section 9 of chapter 93A, for
- 6 any money or property obtained as a result of such unlicensed debt collection activity in addition
- 7 to any other damages allowed by law."
