Senate Bill 288

(Senator Zirkin)

Finance

Public Schools - Smoking on School Property - Prohibition

This bill prohibits smoking on public school property at all times. It defines "smoking" as the burning of a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe, or other device or substance that contains tobacco. An individual who violates this bill is subject to a civil penalty of \$50 for each violation.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Enforcement can be handled with existing resources. Potential negligible increase in general fund revenue from civil fines.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Current regulations require each local school system to maintain a tobacco-free school environment. The sale or use of tobacco in school buildings in any form is prohibited by everyone, including teachers, other staff, and students at all times. In addition, the sale or use of tobacco in any form is prohibited on school grounds during the school day. Each local school system must post notification to students, staff, and the general public that school buildings and grounds are tobacco-free. Additionally, each local school system is encouraged to make smoking cessation classes available to all employees. Students are prohibited from possessing or using tobacco in any form on the school premises. Further, as stated in § 24-504 of the Health-General Article, smoking is prohibited in any indoor place of employment. This prohibition encompasses teachers'

lounges and other private areas within a school building. However, statute does not specifically prohibit smoking on public school property.
