1 AN ACT concerning

Wicomico County - Seasonal Restaurants - Potable Running Water and Graywater

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a seasonal restaurant in Wicomico County to operate
 without providing potable running water to customers under certain circumstances;
 requiring a certain owner or operator of a seasonal restaurant in Wicomico County
 to dispose of graywater in accordance with certain guidelines and regulations; and
 generally relating to potable running water and graywater at seasonal restaurants
 in Wicomico County.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23	(1) THE RESTAURANT IS LOCATED:
24	(I) ON A FORMER DREDGE SITE; OR

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(II) IN A REMOTE AREA WITH MINIMAL PUBLIC ACCESS;

(2) THE RESTAURANT USES A GRAYWATER SYSTEM; AND

3 (3) A COMMUNITY SEWERAGE SYSTEM IS NOT AVAILABLE TO SERVE 4 THE RESTAURANT.

5 (D) THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A SEASONAL RESTAURANT AUTHORIZED 6 TO OPERATE WITHOUT PROVIDING POTABLE RUNNING WATER TO CUSTOMERS 7 UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION SHALL SAFELY DISPOSE OF GRAYWATER 8 IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY GUIDELINES OR REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE 9 DEPARTMENT, THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, OR A FEDERAL AGENCY.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of the 11 Environment shall notify the Department of Legislative Services within 5 days after an 12 adequate water supply and community sewerage system is available to a seasonal 13 restaurant operating under this Act.

14 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 15 1, 2023. It shall remain effective until 2 years after the day on which the Department of 16 Legislative Services receives notice under Section 2 of this Act, and at the end of the second 17 year, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated 18 and of no further force and effect.
