BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – General Provisions Section 5–823, 5–829, and 5–830 Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - General Provisions 5-823.

- 16 (a) Each bicounty commission shall adopt regulations relating to financial disclosure by its employees.
- 18 (b) The regulations required by this section:
- 19 (1) shall be substantially similar to the State financial disclosure 20 provisions of Subtitle 6 of this title; and
- 21 (2) may not conflict with the financial disclosure provisions for 22 commissioners and applicants specified in §§ 5–824 through 5–828 of this subtitle.
- 23 (c) Each bicounty commission shall submit the regulations adopted under this section, and any amendments to the regulations, to:
- 25 (1) the Ethics Commission; and
- 26 (2) the governing body of each county in which the bicounty commission 27 operates.
