CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

- Higher Education Denial of Transfer Credit Notice and Report
   (Transfer With Success Act)
- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to establish certain procedures that require a public institution of higher education that denies the transfer of credits to report the denial to the institution from which the transfer student originates and to submit a certain report each year to the Commission; requiring certain procedures to direct a certain institution to review a denial of transfer credit; and generally relating to the denial of transfer credits.

  17 THE SENDING INSTITUTION, AFTER RECEIVING NOTICE OF A DENIAL OF TRANSFER
  18 CREDIT, <u>IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RECEIVING INSTITUTION'S DESIGNEE</u>, TO
  19 CONDUCT <u>AN INTERNAL A</u> REVIEW WITHIN <del>15 DAYS TO ADDRESS THE REASONS FOR</del>
  20 <u>THE DENIAL SUBMITTED BY THE RECEIVING INSTITUTION</u> A TIME PERIOD THE
  21 COMMISSION DETERMINES TO BE APPROPRIATE; AND
- 22 (3) EACH PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION TO SUBMIT 23 AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMISSION LISTING ANY DENIALS OF TRANSFER 24 CREDIT AND THE REASONS FOR THE DENIALS.
  - [(b)] (C) The Commission, in collaboration with the public institutions of higher education, shall develop and implement a statewide transfer agreement whereby at least 60 credits of general education, elective, and major courses that a student earns at any community college in the State toward an associate of arts or associate of science degree shall be transferable to any public senior higher education institution in the State for credit toward a bachelor's degree by July 1, 2016.
- [(c)] (D) The Commission, in collaboration with the public institutions of higher education, shall develop and implement a statewide reverse transfer agreement whereby at least 30 credits that a student earns at any public senior higher education institution in the State toward a bachelor's degree are transferable to any community college in the State for credit toward an associate's degree by July 1, 2016.
