SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take

the Second Special Session of 2012. If Section 3 of Chapter 1 of the Acts of the General
Assembly of the Second Special Session of 2012 does not take effect, Section 2 of this Act
shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
