## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007 – St. Mary’s County –**  
3 **SMARTCO’s Computer Technology Learning Center**

4 FOR the purpose of amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007  
5 to provide that a certain grant for the SMARTCO’s Computer Technology  
6 Learning Center may not terminate before a certain date; and generally  
7 relating to amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
9 Chapter 488 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2007  
10 Section 1(3) Item ZA02(BY)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (3) ZA02 LOCAL SENATE INITIATIVES

17 (BY) SMARTCO’s Computer Technology Learning Center. Provide  
18 a grant equal to the lesser of (i) \$50,000 or (ii) the amount of  
19 the matching fund provided, to the Board of Directors of The  
20 Southern Maryland Applied Research and Technology  
21 Consortium, Inc. for planning, repair, renovation, and capital  
22 equipping of the SMARTCO’s Computer Technology Learning  
23 Center, located in Lexington Park. Notwithstanding Section  
24 1(5) of this Act, the matching fund may consist of in kind  
25 contributions or funds expended prior to the effective date of
