12 (h) If a public safety employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 weeks, 13 the employer or its insurer shall pay the public safety employee compensation at the rate 14 set for an award of compensation for a period greater than or equal to 75 weeks but less 15 than 250 weeks under § 9–629 of this subtitle.

17 If a covered employee is awarded compensation for a period equal to or greater than 18 75 weeks but less than 250 weeks, the employer or its insurer shall pay the covered 19 employee weekly compensation that equals two-thirds of the average weekly wage of the 20 covered employee but does not exceed one-third of the State average weekly wage.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any claims arising from events occurring before the effective date of this Act.
