AN ACT concerning
Business Regulation – Restaurants and Traders – Licensing Requirements
FOR the purpose of repealing altering an exception for licensed restaurants, and establishing an exception for certain businesses that generate less than a certain percentage of sales from nonfood items, to the requirement that a person who does business as a trader or an exhibitor have a trader's license to apply only to restaurants that generate less than a certain percentage of their sales from nonfood items; and generally relating to restaurant and trader's licenses.
