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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Horse Riding – Helmet Requirement for Minors**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an adult from allowing certain minors to ride a horse on  
4 certain property unless the minor is wearing a helmet that meets certain standards;  
5 and generally relating to helmet requirements and horse riding.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Transportation**

2 In the Maryland Vehicle Law, the following words have the meanings indicated,  
3 unless the context requires otherwise.

4 11-127.

5 "Highway" means:

6 (1) The entire width between the boundary lines of any way or  
7 thoroughfare of which any part is used by the public for vehicular travel, whether or not  
8 the way or thoroughfare has been dedicated to the public and accepted by any proper  
9 authority; and

10 (2) For purposes of the application of State laws, the entire width between  
11 the boundary lines of any way or thoroughfare used for purposes of vehicular travel on any  
12 property owned, leased, or controlled by the United States government and located in the  
13 State.

15 (a) Every person riding an animal or driving an animal-drawn vehicle on a  
16 roadway has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver  
17 of a vehicle by this title, except for those provisions of this title that by their very nature  
18 cannot apply.

19 (b) (1) Except in Charles, Worcester, and St. Mary's counties, or as provided  
20 in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person may not ride an animal or drive an  
21 animal-drawn vehicle on:

22 (i) Any divided highway where the posted maximum speed limit is  
23 more than 35 miles per hour; or

24 (ii) Any controlled access highway.

25 (2) In Anne Arundel County, a person may ride an animal on any part of a  
26 highway described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, other than on its roadway or  
27 shoulder.

28 **(C) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "HORSE" INCLUDES DONKEYS, MULES, AND**  
29 **PONIES.**

30 **(2) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,**  
31 **THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO HORSE RIDING ON:**

32 **1. A HIGHWAY;**

1                   2.     A PUBLIC HORSE-RIDING PATH OR TRAIL; OR

2                   3.     THE GROUNDS OF A FACILITY ~~THAT~~:

3                   A.     WHOSE PRIMARY PURPOSE IS EQUESTRIAN  
4 ACTIVITIES; AND

5                   B.     THAT SOLICITS OR OFFERS TO THE PUBLIC  
6 RECREATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL, THERAPEUTIC, OR COMPETITIVE EQUESTRIAN  
7 ACTIVITIES.

8                   (ii)    THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A MINOR WHO IS:

9                   1.     CROSSING A PUBLIC HIGHWAY THAT SEPARATES  
10 PRIVATELY OWNED LAND;

11                  2.     ENGAGED IN AN AGRICULTURAL PRACTICE OR  
12 PURSUIT; ~~OR~~

13                  3.     A MEMBER OF AN AMISH OR A MENNONITE  
14 COMMUNITY; OR

15                  4.     RECEIVING THERAPY SERVICES FROM A LICENSED  
16 MEDICAL PROVIDER AND FOR WHOM THE USE OF AN ALTERNATIVE HELMET IS  
17 NECESSARY, APPROPRIATE, AND IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROFESSIONAL  
18 ASSOCIATION OF THERAPEUTIC HORSEMANSHIP INTERNATIONAL'S GUIDELINES  
19 FOR ALTERNATIVE HELMET USE.

20                  (3)    AN ADULT WHO IS PRESENT AND DIRECTLY SUPERVISING A  
21 MINOR MAY NOT ALLOW THE MINOR TO RIDE A HORSE UNLESS THE MINOR IS  
22 WEARING A PROPERLY SECURED HELMET THAT MEETS OR EXCEEDS THE  
23 STANDARDS OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF TESTING AND MATERIALS FOR  
24 PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR USED IN EQUESTRIAN RIDING.

25                  (4)    A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION INVOLVING AN ADULT  
26 SUPERVISING MULTIPLE MINORS AT THE SAME TIME SHALL BE TREATED AS A  
27 SINGLE VIOLATION.

28                  SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
29 October 1, 2024.
