- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from making a certain electronic communication with the intent to terrify, intimidate, or harass a minor, or 4 5 threaten to inflict injury or physical harm to a minor or property of the minor; 6 providing that a violation of this Act is a misdemeanor; establishing certain 7 penalties; providing for the application of this Act; providing that this Act may 8 not be construed to have any effect on the lawfulness of certain policies of 9 electronic mail service providers; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the electronic harassment of a minor. 10
