A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Entrepreneurial Equity Act

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Labor and certain professional licensing 4 boards to waive certain license and registration fees imposed on certain persons 5 establishing a new business under certain circumstances; requiring the State 6 Department of Assessments and Taxation to waive certain recording and filing fees 7 imposed on a person establishing a new business under certain circumstances; 8 requiring the Department of Commerce to direct a certain percentage of funding 9 budgeted for the State's economic development and financial assistance programs to be allocated to supporting certain organizations and programs; requiring the 10 11 Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning within the Maryland 12 Department of Labor to direct a certain percentage of workforce development 13 funding to be allocated to supporting certain organizations and programs; requiring the Office of State Procurement within the Department of General Services to direct 14 15 a certain percentage of certain procurements designated for the small business 16 reserve to certain businesses that have been in operation for a certain period of time; 17 and generally relating to fee relief, economic development assistance, and 18 procurement opportunities for new and recently established small businesses.

- 22 (a) (1) This section applies to a procurement by any unit or agency of the 23 Executive Branch of State government for goods, supplies, services, maintenance, 24 construction, construction—related services, architectural services, or engineering services.
- 25 (2) This section does not apply to:

- 27 (ii) procurements involving expenditures of federal dollars, to the 28 extent that inclusion in the small business reserve program conflicts with federal law or 29 grant provisions;

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1 (v) term and master contracts exempted under subsection (c) of this 2 section. 3 (b) [A] SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, (1) (I)A procurement with a total dollar value between \$50,000 and \$500,000 shall be designated 4 5 for the small business reserve. 6 **(II)** THE **OFFICE** \mathbf{OF} STATE **PROCUREMENT** IN THE 7 DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES SHALL DIRECT AT LEAST 10% OF ALL OPEN PROCUREMENTS DESIGNATED FOR THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE TO BUSINESSES 8 9 THAT HAVE BEEN IN OPERATION FOR LESS THAN 5 YEARS AND WHOSE PRINCIPAL 10 PLACE OF BUSINESS IS LOCATED IN THE STATE. 11 Each unit or agency shall implement this subsection in a manner (2)12 consistent with all applicable statutes, including the requirements of Subtitle 3 of this title. 13 A procurement may be exempt from designation under subsection (b) of 14 this section if the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs 15 certifies, concurrently with review of any waiver determinations for certified minority 16 business enterprise participation contract goals, that it is not practicable to do so. 17 The Office of State Procurement in the Department of General Services (2)shall assist the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs in 18 establishing procedures and guidelines for the exemption of procurements under paragraph 19 20(1) of this subsection. 21SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 23 243 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
